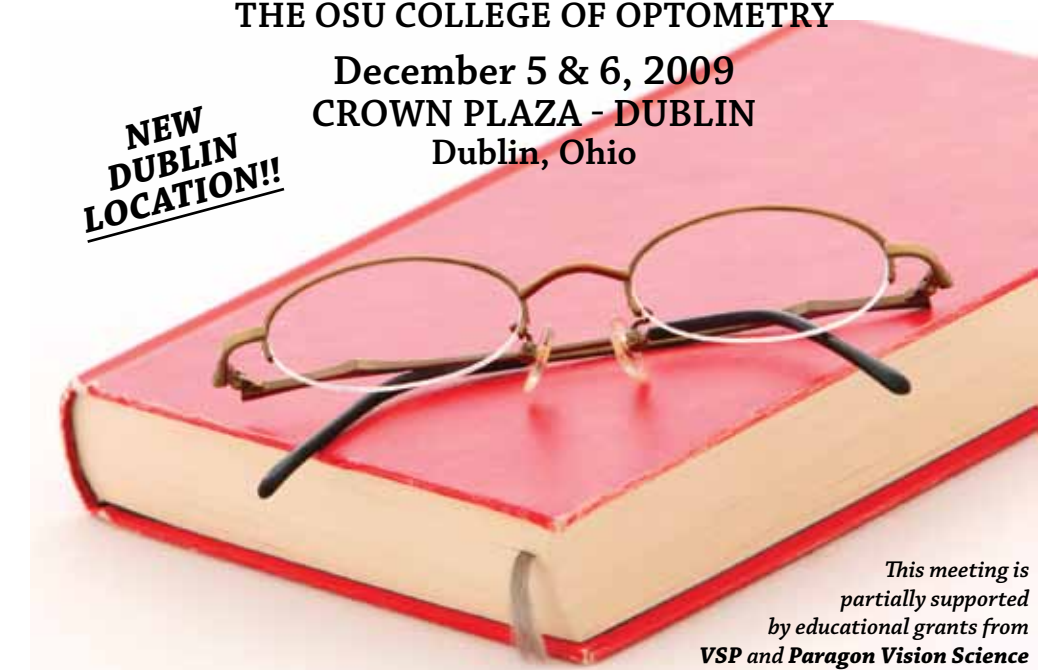

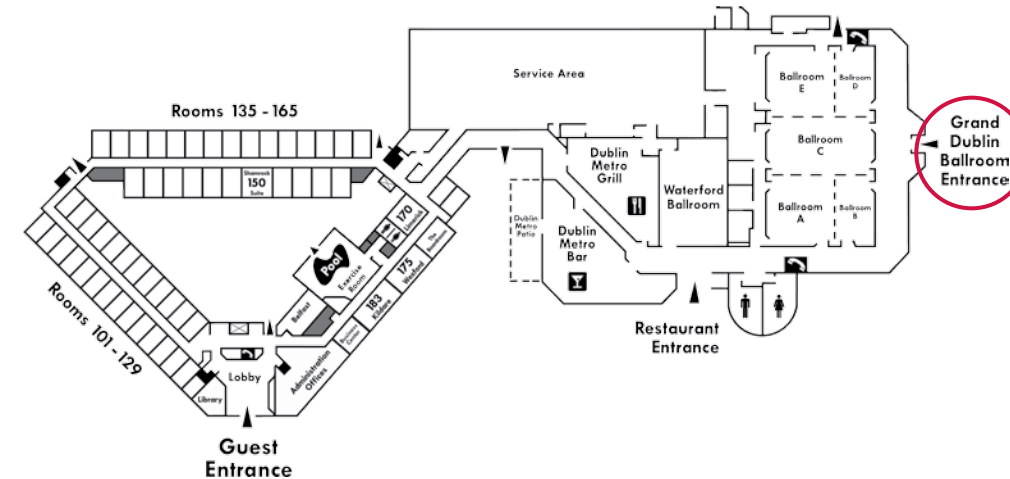

8:30 a.m. Bowman's Layer in Corneal Pathophysiology

Bowman's layer in the human cornea is designed to provide both structure and function to corneal health and performance. In spite of its long history of study, controversies remain on its structure and function. Bowman's layer will be discussed in detail to explain its role in epithelial-stromal interactions, wound healing, maintenance of corneal curvature, and ocular disease prevention. (1 hr)

9:30 - 11:30 a.m. (*) Tales from the Trenches: Posterior Segment

Interesting cases from over two decades in an ophthalmology academic referral center are presented in a grand rounds case presentation format. Cases will be challenging yet clinically common. The course is designed to stimulate differential diagnosis, utilize diagnostic technology and discuss various treatment strategies. (2 hrs)

8:30 a.m. (*) Culturing 101

This course will discuss how to incorporate ocular surface culturing into the optometric practice. The different types of culture media will be discussed as well as how to obtain an ocular culture. The course will conclude with case discussion and how ocular cultures were used. (1 hr)

9:30 a.m. (*) 21st Century IOLs

Amit Tanden, MD

Patients facing cataract surgery have many different options for IOL implantation including those to treat presbyopia and residual astigmatism. This course will review many of these options and discuss which options are proving best for which patients. (1 hr)

10:30 a.m. (*) Hypertension Drug Therapy Overview

High blood pressure is a common ailment found in a large percentage of our patients. This course will review the medications many of patients will be taking to treat their hypertension and will cover both the common systemic and ocular side effects of these drugs. (1 hr)

1:00 p.m. (*) Contemporary Issues in Orthokeratology: Quality of Vision and Microbial Keratitis

This course will review the optical and visual changes associated with orthokeratology (in comparison to refractive surgery) and the risks of microbial keratitis associated with orthokeratology (in comparison to other contact lens modalities). (1 hr)

2:00 p.m. (*) My Top 5 Oral Medications for Optometric Practices

Primary care optometrists routinely encounter ocular conditions that require the use of oral medications for proper treatment. Dr. Nixon will highlight the five top oral medications he utilizes in practice and the conditions they treat. (1 hr)

3:00 p.m. (*) Contemporary Medical Glaucoma Strategies

Today's eyecare providers benefit from numerous medications that are effective in lowering intraocular pressure. Current thoughts on the use of these medications in the management of glaucoma and ocular hypertension will be reviewed. Topics will include: when to treat, target pressures, monocular trials, treatment algorithms, and maximal medical therapy. (1 hr)
