All courses have been submitted for COPE approval.

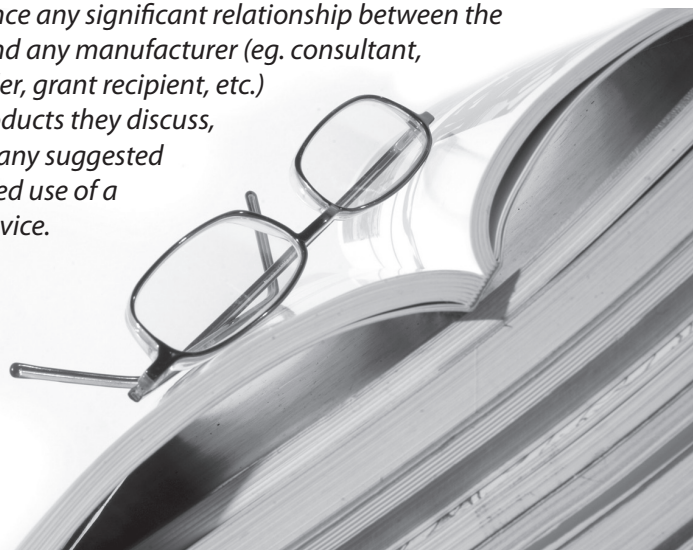
All participants will receive their Attendance Transcript at the conclusion of their final course attended for the weekend.

MORE Interesting Cases from the Columbus VA

As a Central Ohio primary care entry point into the Department of Veterans Affairs health care system, the Optometry Clinic at the Chalmers Wylie Veterans Affairs Health Clinic sees many interesting patients with a wide variety of case histories and clinical conditions. In this 3 hour discussion the VA Optometry Clinic staff and residents will present cases involving structures from the cornea through the optic nerve. Systemic manifestations associated with the various conditions will be included.

Attendees will be able to participate in the presentations using TurningPoint technology (clickers). Topical areas include:

Bilateral Ulcerative Keratitis, Uveitis, Blunt Trauma (from a fishing bobber!),
Optic Nerve Head Drusen, Lymphoma, and MORE!

8:30 - 10:30 a.m. (*) **The Challenges of Diabetes from Gene to Society.**

David C. Aron, MD

Diabetes has become an epidemic. We have traditionally addressed such a challenge with a risk factor approach directed at individuals. However, this approach has been ineffective. We need to think about the factors that contribute to the epidemic at multiple levels – from the gene to society and every level in between. Each of these levels present their own challenges. This session will describe those levels and some of those challenges. (2 hrs)

10:30 a.m. (*) **Recent Advances in Drug Treatment for Diabetes.**

An increased understanding of the physiologic control of glucose in the body has led to the development of several new classes of agents for the treatment of diabetes. This lecture will present these important classes of medicines. (1 hr)

1:00 p.m. **Contact Lens Update: Challenges and Solutions**

Many developments in contact lens materials, designs, and solutions have benefited our patients such that clear vision and comfort is expected for ALL patients. This course will provide an update on CL technologies and care to include CL bifocal choices for 2012! (1 hr)

This lecture will review the pathophysiology of an interesting case of cataract formation along with its unusual resolution. (1 hr)

This lecture will present videos of different techniques (including chop and divide and conquer), along with devices used for challenging cases (malyugan ring and trypan blue). (1 hr)

8:30 a.m. (*) **Co-Management of Post-Operative Cataract Patients.**

Several cases of common and not so common post-op findings will be presented and discussed. The attendee should be more comfortable with the co-management of the post-op cataract patient at that end of this course. (1 hr)

9:30 a.m. (*) **Anterior Uveitis**

This lecture will present discussion on examination findings, underlying systemic associations, lab work-up and treatment for anterior uveitis. A representative case of sarcoidosis will be also be presented to reinforce these details. (1 hr)

While it may be uncomfortable to discuss, sexually transmitted diseases (STDs) often have ocular manifestations. This lecture will provide a brief overview of the diagnosis and management of common STDs known to affect the eyes. (1 hr)

Regardless of the chosen mode of practice, clinicians must determine when or if a patient should be referred to a retina specialist. This lecture will offer suggestions on cases that can be monitored in house and those that should be forwarded on for treatment. (1 hr)

This course reviews common retinal conditions that may present with elevations in the retina. Because elevated retinal lesions can potentially be sight and/or life threatening, it is essential to make a correct diagnosis. This lecture will review the funduscopic appearance and OCT characteristics of common elevated retinal lesions and provide referral guidelines for primary care optometrists. (1 hr)
