

Do you have problems with your field of vision?

What is being investigated in this study?

The study investigates how the two eyes work together in people with field of vision problems.

Am I eligible to be a part of this research?

You are eligible if you are 18 years of age or older and have been diagnosed with a field of vision problem. Typical conditions causing field of vision problems are glaucoma, age-related macular degeneration, retinitis pigmentosa and diabetic retinopathy.

What does the research involve if I participate?

Participation will involve having your vision tested. To measure your vision, you will verbally report what you see on some tests. On other tests, you will indicate what you see by pressing selected keys on the computer keyboard or drawing out what you see.

What are my responsibilities as a subject in this research?

To participate, you must attend 2-4 sessions of up to 2 hours each for over a 1-3 weeks period.

What will I get in return?

You will be compensated \$15 per hour and provided free parking pass (if required) for each visit.

What are the benefits to me and society?

There is a possibility you will gain more insight about your visual ability after the study. The information gathered will also expand our knowledge base on the scientific foundation of field of vision loss and potentially improves its clinical diagnosis.
